She is not the first South Asian doll to be created by American Girl, but she is the first South Asian to be featured as the "Girl of the Year". There are some people who are skeptic about Kavi being portrayed as fair-skinned and that is a legitimate argument, but this is nevertheless a big leap in recognition of Indian Americans and a celebration of their heritage. There is a sense of pride, positive curiosity, and joy when seeing young minority girls embrace their ethnic wear. For Kavi, her wardrobe collection includes an ornate blue and red lehenga choli with matching gold jewelry.



Kavi's story will be shared in an illustrated paperback journal that comes with the doll and a hardcover novel, "It's Showtime, Kavi," by Varsha Bajaj debuting in March 2023. Bajaj was one of the experts who worked with American Girl to ensure Kavi's story details are rooted in authentic practices, culture, and the history of India.

## 2023 Chinese Zodiac Year of the Rabbit



What exactly is the Chinese zodiac and how did it come about? The Chinese zodiac, which is sometimes referred to as Shengxiao (which literally translates as "born resembling"), which is a cycle that lasts for a total of 12 years, and each year is attributed to a different animal. Starts with Rat, the Ox, the Tiger, the Rabbit, the Dragon, the Snake, the Horse, the Goat, the Monkey, the Rooster, the Dog, and the Pig are the 12 animals, listed in order.

Myths have it that the twelve animals that make up the Chinese zodiac were chosen through a competition that was open to all of the animals at the time. In order to win, the animals had to make it across a swift-moving river and arrive at the finish line on the shore. The winners of the first twelve places in the race will be picked to symbolize every twelve years of the Chinese zodiac.

The Chinese zodiac year 2023 is the fourth year of the cycle. Since the Rabbit represents the fourth zodiacal animal in China. Hence, 2023 is the Water Rabbit's year. To the Chinese, the Rabbit represents long life, harmony, and good fortune. Consequently, the Chinese believe that 2023 will be a year of hope.
